

For most, a state soccer championship would highlight a high school career. Olivia tended goal for our Lady Rams. But when asked, she said, "The 24-Hour Art Challenge is the highlight of my year. My friend and I stayed up 24 hours straight! Ten hours in, I scrapped my original idea, covered the whole canvas in blue, and started from there."

When viewing her finished piece, the layers kept emerging. Initially, one sees a silhouette of a guitar on a blue backdrop. Slowly, the guitar morphs into an island and its reflection in the ocean. If you look closer, the island begins as a cityscape and transitions to a tree-lined paradise.

Olivia's next art project includes developing Billings Central's MasterLube mural, an annual art competition between the local high schools.

But art is not a future career Olivia plans on. Instead, she wants to pursue becoming a doctor. "I am passionate about art, but I also love STEM. The two balance me

out." She continues, "Being a doctor, helping someone out that way, it's how I want to give back." She hopes to attend the University of Notre Dame or the University of Colorado Boulder.

Olivia did not start her education in our Catholic schools. As many do, she made the transition at middle school. Hers is the last class to experience St. Francis Upper at the Kate Fratt Building, before transitioning to the new St. Francis Catholic beginning in 7th grade.

As Olivia reminisces, "Coming here was lights on for me. I'd say the best thing is our teachers. I've learned so much from them; I know they care for me."

LET THE LITTLE CHILDREN COME TO ME!

MAYFAIR SPECIAL PROJECT BENEFITS OUR LITTLEST RAMS AT ST. FRANCIS EARLY CHILDHOOD Mayfair Minute

A s our Lord said, "Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of heaven belongs to such as these"

(Matthew 19:14).

We follow the example of Christ by blessing our littlest Rams and their families with this year's Mayfair special project – much needed facility upgrades and long overdue safety improvements for the preschoolers of St. Francis Early Childhood Education Center.

Originally built in 1957, the building housed both St. Pius X Catholic Church and School. When Billings' Catholic schools consolidated into one system in the 1980's, it became St. Francis Intermediate until 2017, the year our new St. Francis K-8 Catholic School opened. Since then, our preschool and daycare have called it home.

"The building needs attention to make it a great, usable space for our littlest kids," says Michelle Trafton, Director of the Early Childhood Center.

The building was designed for older students ages 6 to 12. Today, it serves ages 3 to 6. The playground equipment, with its high platforms and tall slides, are well above the ground leaving our 3-year-olds susceptible to high falls. Bathroom sinks, countertops, and toilets must be lowered for little legs.

The center is aging. The roof leaks in hard rain and heavy snow. Parents and their children must navigate the buckets on the floor collecting the water. Furnaces are inefficient and their bulky size take up room in each

classroom. There is needed ventilation in a hot, stuffy gym. Corroding metal pipes must be replaced. Windows let in a draft. Sills and counters are softening with moisture. Fraying carpets are unsanitary for kids playing on the ground. Every inch could use paint.

A full and robust St. Francis Early Childhood Center is vital to our schools. Families take root in our Catholic schools community beginning in early childhood. When kindergarten does come, parents know that our Catholic schools are where their child is meant to be!

In fact, this is the experience of Quinn and Alicia Donovan – our 2023 Mayfair Chairs. As they experienced St. Francis Early Childhood Center for their son, Bentley, they knew Billings Catholic Schools was right for them. They placed him in Kindergarten at St. Francis.

"The preschool teachers are incredible! We could see Bentley learning every day," says Alicia. "It was natural to continue on."

A strong early childhood program benefits our entire system with a steady stream of kids for our schools. A full early childhood program means a full St. Francis Catholic which means a full Billings Central Catholic.

How do we build a strong early childhood program that parents desire? Three things: great teachers teaching great things in a great environment. We have two: great teachers teaching great things. *Help give a great environment to our littlest students!*



ETERNAL REST GRANT UNTO THEM O LORD

ur Billings Catholic Schools lost two patriarchs of the family recently - Ralph Studer, Jr. and James "Ziggy" Ziegler. Both of these great men's contributions to the Billings Catholic Schools and the Foundation will be felt for generations to come.



Ralph graduated from Billings Central Catholic High School in 1950. He met his wife, Cemie, at the University of Notre Dame where he studied in Mechanical Engineering. He and his brother, Dean, began Studer Construction building miles of roads in Montana, Wyoming, and RALPH Yellowstone Park. All 9 of their kids attended

Catholic Schools. Ralph's life was one of deep faith and an abiding humor. He was instrumental in establishing the Billings Area Catholic Education Trust (BACET), supported Mayfair, and gave back to the schools in all the ways he could. Upon the passing of his wife, Cemie, he established the Ralph and Cemie Studer Scholarship in honor of her. For his efforts, he was awarded the Billings Catholic Schools Legacy Award in 2017.

Ziggy, as everyone affectionately called him, was a transplant to Billings. He and his wife, Stella, became fixtures of our Billings Catholic Schools community

upon arrival in 1977. They sent their 5 children to our schools. But not just their kids! Ziggy and Stella have supported numerous students in our schools throughout the years. They volunteered and chaired Mayfair. For decades, Ziggy warmed up the Mayfair crowd with a game of heads and tails. As a restaurateur with

his wife Stella, they would give generously to the live auction every year. As avid Rams supporters, Ziggy could be seen in the bleachers at football and basketball games. Beyond our schools, Ziggy was dedicated to prison ministry. He was a public servant for many years as auditor and county commissioner. Ziggy and Stella were awarded the Billings Catholic Schools Legacy award in 2019.
